

These "Shout Outs" are mentioned on our daily announcement and the slips are sent home after.

At each rally the following happens:

A class showing the most Warrior Pride in our common areas (hallways, outside, lunchroom, etc.) is awarded the **Traveling Trophy**...it is a trophy that is highly sought after and so the kids work really hard as a class to be awarded the Traveling Trophy!

- Two students from each class are given the Character Award for showing the most Character in relation to the character word of the month.
- Warrior Prizes are chosen from the names pulled out of the Warrior Way Ticket classroom buckets.
- We do our Warrior Way Chant!

STARTING THE DAY

CLASS STARTS: 8:15 A.M.(students should be in the classroom & ready at 8:10 A.M.)

PARENT DROPOFF: Our recommended student arrival time is 7:45 A.M. Students can not be dropped off any earlier than 7:30 A.M. For safety purposes, student drop off will take place in the parking lot in front of the main entrance door (look for the B) until 8:10 A.M. Please do not park your vehicle, this is a drop-off area only. We also need all users of the drop off area to always pull forward as far as possible so more vehicles can unload. Students arriving after 8:15 A.M. should enter through the main doors and must be checked in at the office by an adult.

BUSING: Buses start dropping off at school as early as 7:30 A.M. (If they are on a morning transfer, we have them come into school instead of transferring). If you have not gotten your bus pass, please call 218-454-6900. If there is an issue with or on the bus, the first call is to Reichert's Bus Company at: 218-829-6955.

walking my child into school?: In order to foster independence and monitor all persons entering the building, we do not have parents/families walk their children to the classrooms. If you are volunteering, you must have the required background check paperwork completed/approved and check in at the office.

ENDING OUR DAY

School Ends at: 2:50 P.M.

Parent Pick-up: All student pick up will be curbside in the parking lot (by the library doors). Unless you are picking up early, there will be no entering the building during pickup. If you are picking up early, enter the office by the big B, have your license ready and we will call your child down to the office.

BUSING: Buses start picking up at 2:50 P.M. If a student is set to have a TRANSFER, they will stay at school, in the gym, until the buses return. By keeping at school, students are on the road for a shorter period of time. They will then get on the bus around 3:35 P.M. when the buses come back for transfer. If they only have one time listed on their bus card (no transfer) they go right on the bus. If you have not gotten your bus pass, call 218-454-6900. If there is an issue with or on the bus, the first call is to Reichert's Bus Company at: 218-829-6955.

DEPARTURE CHANGES: Must be called into the office by 2:20 P.M. to be sure we get the message to the classroom. Main office: 218-961-6860

OFTEN LATE TO PICK UP: No problem (as long as there is space available)! Please sign your child up for Fun'n Friends so you have a quick solution. We do not have staff to stay after hours to monitor students. Thank you for your understanding!

WHEN IS YOUR CHILD TOO SICK FOR SCHOOL?

Antibiotics: If a child has started an antibiotic, they should wait 24 hours before returning to school.


<u>Diarrhea:</u> Please do not send your child to school for 24 hours after the last episode.

<u>Doctor recommendation:</u> Always rely on what your doctor recommends and please ask them for a note to bring to school if your child's condition required an office visit.

Fever: If your child has a temperature of 100 degrees F or more, they should stay home for 24 hours after the fever has broken (without the assistance of medication).

WEATHER CHANGES...

SPRING is here...we think! This time of year brings a lot of unpredictability in what mother nature delivers. Please pay attention to the weather forecast, dress your child in layers, and err on the side of caution as we go outside for recess for 30 minutes each day unless it is raining. Therefore, students are needing to be dressed appropriately for safe play. When it has been wet or we are recovering from a snow storm, we have students wear snow pants to keep them dry. If there is a hardship and you are needing support, you may contact our collaborative worker, Brenna Bair at: (218) 961-6888.



ATTENDANCE...

Daily school attendance is required by the State of Minnesota, and is critical for students to be successful in school. If your student is going to be late or absent, please call 218-961-6860 or or BETTER YET enter the absences on Skyward Family Access. If you call prior to 7:30 a.m., when leaving a message, be sure to state your child's full name, their teacher, and the reason for the absence. If your student is going to a doctor's appointment, please bring a note from that practitioner when the student returns. If your student has been sick for three consecutive days, the district asks that a doctor's note be provided following that fourth day to be excused. Failure of an adult to call in or send a note the following day will result in an unexcused absence. Guardians are asked to refer to the district calendar (can be found on our Nisswa School Website) to plan family trips. During statewide testing weeks, it is extremely important to have your children well rested and in school.

HOMEWORK:

We ask that you take some time to support your student by encouraging them to come to school prepared for the day. Your help ensures that your student learns great work habits, are successful in their school work and continue the year on a positive note. Together we can make the school year a

successful and positive experience.
